I was told by Private, S. Cornell, 12th. Battalion, C. Q., on about September 27th when I was with the Battalion that he had seen Millett wounded at Ypres I think on September 20th. He saw him carried away to the D Station. I have heard that he has died since. I know Millett well, he was stout, dark, maggety, came from Queensland. Cornell is still with the Battalion.

He was a mate of mine and came over in same Rfts. 17th, of 12th Battn. He was wounded just immediately before we hopped over in the Polygon Wood stntn on Sep. 20th. A shell got him and both his heels were blown off. He was in C.Coy., but I do not remember his Pltn. Tom Hartland, S/B. C.Coy. 9th Pltn.. told me afterwards that he bandaged him up and took him to 1st Aid post, but I do not know what happened to him after, but I heard that he died. He came from Queensland.

Re No. 5421 Pte. W.G. Millett, the only information I can give you, is, he was severely wounded, in both feet, on the morning of 20th September 1917 "by shell fire". He passed through our own dressing station on to the "Field Ambulance" where he died of his wounds. There is no doubt he would be buried in a Military Cemetery; also his grave registered, being that far behind the line.





Dear Sir,

In reply to your inquiry about - 5421 Pte W.H.G. Millett, 12th Bn, A.I.F., we beg to inform you that we have received a report from the O.C. of the 10th Casualty Clearing Station, stating that Pte. Millett died on September 20th 1917, from shell wounds in both feet and was buried in Ijssenthoek Cemetery Plot 23. No.3 19A.

We have also received an unofficial report from - 5395 Pte J.F. Hey, 12th Bn, A.I.F., lately at No.1 Command Depot Sutton Veny, who stated that Pte Millet was very badly wounded in both feet by a shelly just before the "hop over" at Polygon Wood on Sept: 20th.

Stretcher-bearer T. Hartland of the same coy, told Pte Hey that he bandaged him up and took him to the dressing station; he heard afterwards that he had died.

We are continuing our inquiries and will at once forward you any information we may obtain. Trusting that these details will be of some assistance to you,
