I saw him wounded at Zonnebeke Lake, near Ypres, He was caught by a shell, fragments of which hit him about the body. He was taken away to the Dressing Station, in an unconscious condition, but died before reaching there. Casualty happened whilst he was out bandaging up wounded men. I knew him very well, he was the only man of that name in the unit. I do not know place of burial. It would be in either the Hilitary Cemetery at Zonnebeke Lake, or at Rennenghelst. pefer to Kause, A.H.C. Details, attachedto the lat Brigade, A.F.A. who is now in France, and who can, I think, give full details of burial.


